Secure Cabinet Defibrillator Carry Case

Always call 999 first, to summon medical help.

You do not need training to use a defibrillator in an emergency.



Fully automatic defibrillator (AED).

This is a public access defibrillator for use by anyone in an emergency. No training is needed. Promoted by the British Heart Foundation, it is an SP1 Fully Automatic Defibrillator. Sometimes these are called AED's (automatic external defibrillator).

The defibrillator is kept safe and ready to use in a locked, wall-mounted cabinet. You can get the secure access code for the cabinet by phoning 999 in an emergency, to report the situation and call for medical help.

THE LOCATION IS 6A RBC

Tell this to the 999 operator, who will give you the code to open the cabinet.

In an emergency if you think someone has heart failure:

- 1
Call 999, and get the access code (location 6A RBC)
- 2
Open the cabinet and take the contents to the casualty
- 3
Use for a child or an adult, by selecting the child or adult setting (top left of the device)
- 4
Switch on using the green button
- 5
Follow all the voice-prompt instructions given by the device
- 6
Continue following the voice instructions until 999 medical help arrives

This defibrillator is fully automatic and assesses heart rhythm of the casualty. It will NOT give a shock to anyone who does not need it.


The defibrillator is maintained by Winchester Working Men's Housing Society (WWMHS) and is registered with the emergency 999 network. Always call 999 first in an emergency.
